Hazing Prevention & Awareness

The Stop Campus Hazing Act, which went into effect on Jan. 1, 2025, establishes new federal reporting requirements and definitions regarding incidents of hazing by student organizations. Additionally, the Act imposes policy and programming requirements regarding the prevention and awareness of issues caused by hazing, which are important for faculty and staff to be aware of. Cuba Summer Immersion Experience

The Lougheed Center for Applied Learning is now accepting <u>applications</u> for students interested in the Cuba Summer Immersion Experience. The program will run from June 2 to July 2. Students will earn six credits, and SUNY Potsdam professors will teach all courses. The total cost is \$6,700, but very generous scholarships are available. Spring Internships

The registration deadline for Spring 2025 internships is Monday, Feb. 10. Students can schedule internship advising appointments with Internship Coordinator Max Grube by booking through Starfish. Appointments include searching for internship sites, contacting sites and completing a Handshake proposal, among other assistance. The deadline for LoCAL internship stipend applications has been extended to Monday, Feb. 10. Any student who submits a new stipend application and receives an award will receive a single payment during the middle of the Spring 2025 semester. Course Syllabi Requirements

Writing Tutors

<u>Writers' Block tutors</u> provide students with one-to-one tutoring on any writing assignment, seven days per week.
